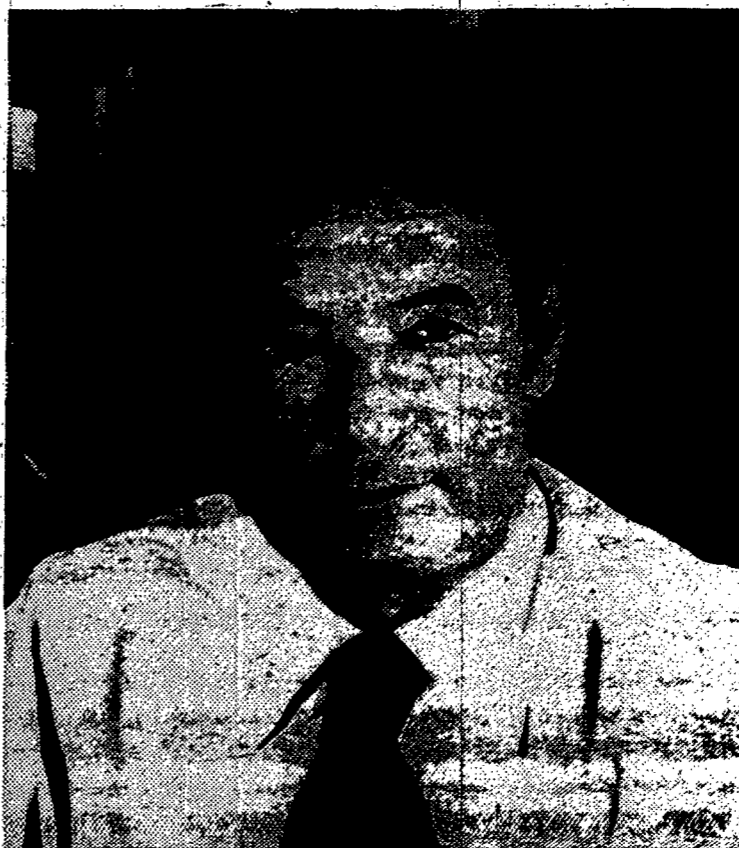
For Chief Judge:

Jacob Fuchsberg can change the status quo. He is a doer. He has the experience and dedication to bring about reform in our courts.

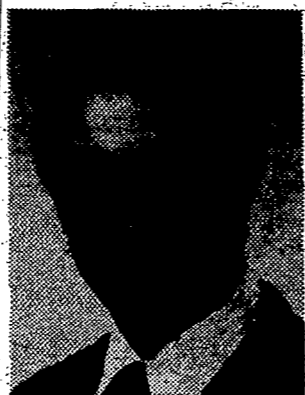

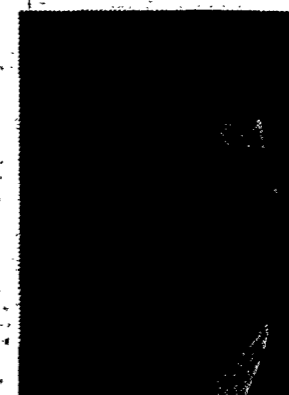
Benjamin P. Whitaker, Jr.
