## F. J. Kelly

**Hornell** — Francis J. Kelly of North Hornell, a former postmaster here, died Nov. 6, 1973. Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated in St. Ann's Church.

Mr. Kelly was active in Democratic party affairs, serving as city chairman for eight years and as a member of the party's Steuben County committee for 15 years. Appointed postmaster in 1933 he held the position for 30 years. During that time, he was a director for four years of the National Association of Postmasters.

In the Knights of Columbus, he served 10 one-year terms as grand knight of Hornell Council, and eight terms as 33rd. district deputy and faithful navigator of the Fourth Degree Assembly.

He was a former president of the Kiwanis Club, the local American Legion Post and Elks Lodge, the Nocturnal Adoration and Holy Name societies of St. Ann's, and the Steuben County Health Committee, all of which he helped organize.

Survivors are his widow, two brothers and two sisters, Dr. J. Raymond Kelly of Hornell, William Kelly of Detroit, Mrs. Daniel J. Meagher of Rochester and Mrs. J. Raymond Ottman of Los Angeles.
