Baptists Hail Vatican's U.N. Doc

Pineville, La. [RNS] — Louisiana Southern Baptists deleted the word "white" from their membership requirements and praised the Vatican for a statement on religious liberty in actions taken at their annual meeting here.

By an almost unanimous voice vote, messengers to the convention altered the constitutional provision allowing only "white Baptist churches in good standing" to join, letting the membership requirement read simply 'churches in good standing.'

A statement praising the Vatican for its "forthright declaration of freedom to the United Nations" was described by one observer as "perhaps the most striking resolution offered."

Criticism of the Catholic Church for its alleged opposition to religious freedom has been a common feature of Baptist gatherings in the past.

The Vatican's statement, presented to the U.N. in late October, was in reference to a proposed declaration or convention on religious liberty.

Such a document, the Vatican suggested, should include the affirmation:

"Everyone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religions. This right shall include freedom to adhere or not to adhere to any religion or belief in accordance with the dictates of his conscience, without being subjected to any legal, administrative, political, economic, or other coercion likely to impair his freedom of choice, decision, and exercise in the matter."

In another resolution, the Louisiana Baptist Convention said stands taken by Vice Presidential nominee Gerald Ford in favor of tax aid for non-public schools "would seemingly place the proposed Vice President in personal opposition to separation of church and state."

"We respectfully urge the Vice Presidential nominee to rethink his position due to the fact that upon entering the executive branch of government he will be called upon to help enforce the law as interpreted by the Supreme Court," the Southern Baptists said.

In a resolution on Watergate, the convention said Louisiana Baptists "suffer agony and deep concern" because the "character and worthy goals of the nation are threatened by moral, economic and political crises."

Pro-Life Group Wants War Chest To Be Filled

Export, Pa. — The U.S. Coalition for Life, an anti-abortion group based here, has urged the National Conference of Catholic Bishops to "fill a pro-life war chest designed to give financial support and a morale boost to pro-life activities during the upcoming World Population Year Conference," according to coalition director Randy Engles.

Ms. Englels said her group proposed diverting 50 per cent of the funds from the Campaign for Human Development to the cause.

The group also recommended the bishops give "vigorous public support" to the Helms Amendment to the Foreign Assistance Bill, prohibiting the use of tax funds for abortion and abortion research; appoint a Population Advisory Committee to advise prelates on the World Population Year Conference; support the Hogan Discharge Petition; support a national educational campaign on abortion; and sup-port a special pro-life prayer in the liturgy.

The resolution urged political leaders to "repudiate illegal and questionable manipulation of election processes" and pledged support for "any any and all

constructive efforts of the President and other elected and appointed officials to resolve the Watergate situation and related issues with dispatch and in


