

Canterbury, Rome Publish Statement

London [RNS] — Archbishop Michael Ramsey of Canterbury, spiritual leader of the worldwide Anglican Communion, and Pope Paul VI have jointly given permission for publication of an Anglican-Roman Catholic theological statement on the

meaning and purpose of the Christian ministry.

Announcement of the authorization was made here at Archbishop Ramsey's headquarters.

Publication of "Ministry and Ordination: A Statement on the

Doctrine of the Ministry Agreed by the Anglican-Roman Catholic International Commission" will take place on Dec. 13.

The agreement, which deals with one of the thorniest issues dividing the two Churches, involves the complex and delicate

questions of apostolic succession and the validity of Anglican orders.

Disclosure of the fact of the agreement was made in a statement issued in London by the commission of top theologians following its fifth

meeting, held at St. Augustine's College, Canterbury, from Aug. 28 to Sept. 6.

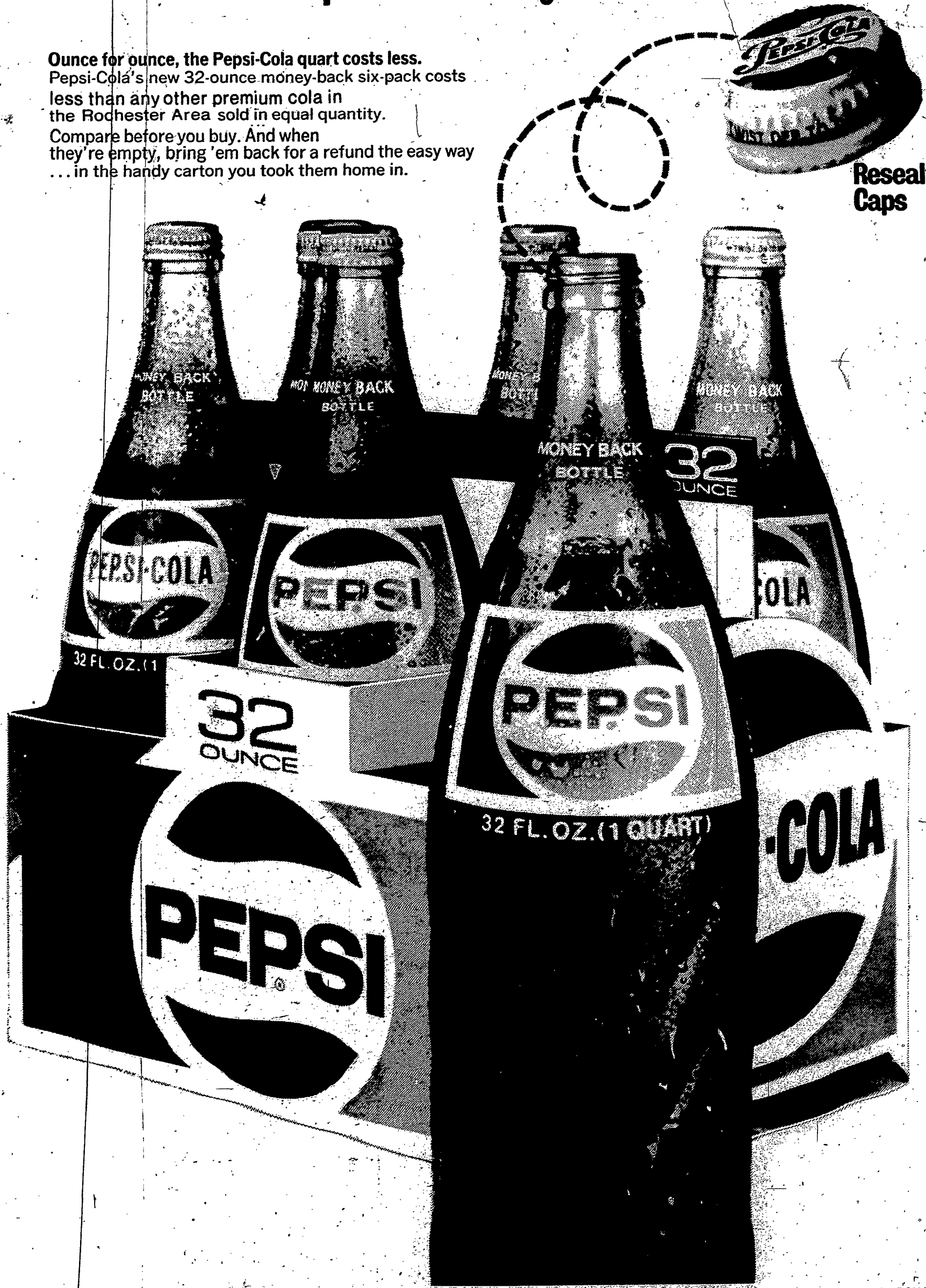
Publication of the agreement was, as required, held up, pending permission of the authorities of the Anglican and Roman Churches.
