

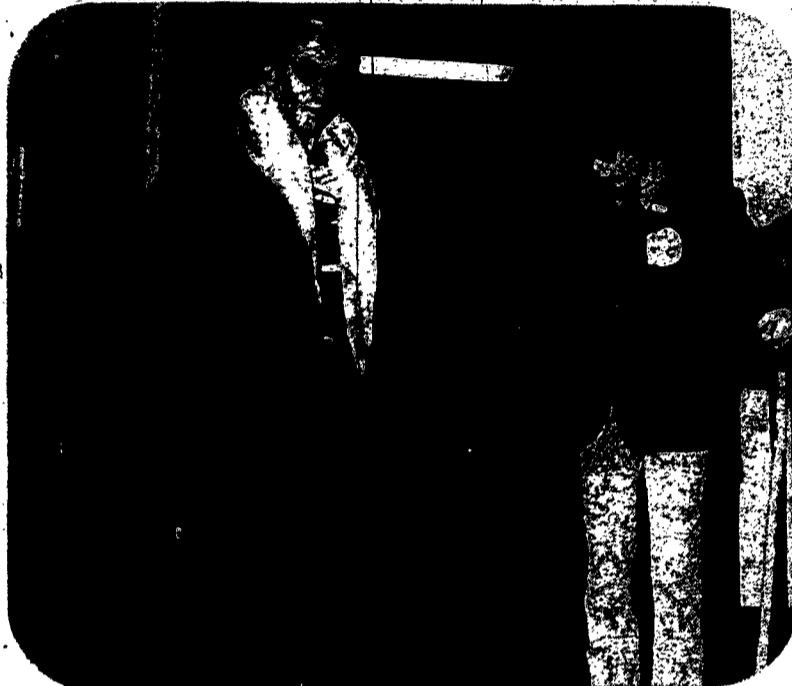
School 17 Youngsters Find Special Way to Say Thank You
