Mass of the Resurrection for John C. Fleming of Fairport was celebrated Jan. 15 at St. John of Rochester Church.

Mr. Fleming, who was east district plant superintendent for the Rochester Telephone Company, died Jan. 11, 1974, at a company awards dinner.

Survivors are his wife, Rosalie, and four children, Nancy, Kathryn, Brian and John; his mother, Mrs. Bridget Fleming; a brother, Brian, of Delaware, and two sisters, Mrs. Mary Malavasi of California and Mrs. Kathleen McSweeney of Canada.

Mr. Fleming was chairman of the Rochester Metropolitan Development Council of the Chamber of Commerce, a director of the telephone company employees' credit union and a member of the Knights of Columbus. He was a Pop Warner League football coach and former commissioner. The team he organized three years ago took the county championship last fall, after a season without defeat.
