Washington, D.C. IRNSI — A National Coalition for Public Education and Religious Liberty (PEARL) has been formed here by 28 religious educational and religious liberties groups to oppose measures that would provide government aid to nonpublic schools.

Suffragan Bishop John Walker of Washington National Cathedral (Episcopal) was chosen as president Leo Pfeffer, a nationally known specialist in church-state legislation, is legal
