Deaths Mrs. Pearson, 90, First St. Charles Lay Teacher

Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated Wednesday, Feb. 13, for Mrs. Evangeline M. Pearson, 90, one of the first lay teachers in the Rochester diocese.

Mrs. Pearson, of 65 Albemarle St., died Feb. 9, 1974, after a two-year—illness Bishop John E McCafferty concelebrated the funeral Mass in Sacred Heart Cathedral with Fathers Thomas Wheeland and Paul Cuddy.

When St. Charles Borromeo parish was organized in 1926, Mrs. Pearson and her husband George granted the use of their home to its first pastor, Father John Sellinger, until the rectory was built two years later.

Mrs. Pearson, who previously had taught at Public School No. 7 for nine years, began teaching at St. Charles School in 1931. She was the first and only lay teacher. there during her 18 years with the school

In 1942, she taught at St. Thomas the Apostle; in 1943, at St. Andrew In 1945, she went back to teach at St. Charles, until her retirement in 1952.

She continued to make use of her teaching ability by tutoring handicapped children part-time.


