Folk Singer Set For 'Life' Dinner

Barbara Breuer-Sipple, a folk singer, will sing at the annual Right-to-Life dinner on March 23. Only a few years ago, Miss Breuer-Sipple was largely unknown, her name familiar only to folksinging devotees. But now, her voice, her instrumental ability, and her song compositions have impressed scores of audiences. She is 22 years old and is from Camden, New Jersey. Her published records so far are *Barbara Sings for Life*, *Journey to Jesus*, and *An American Lament*.

Following a concert in Rochester, Min., about a year ago, the *Post-Bulletin* critic said, "She's got a mellow sound like Judy Collins or Joan Baez... but she's better. Her range is excellent." The *Philadelphia Inquirer* stated in October of 1971 that she "appears to be on the brink of a promising career in writing and performing her own songs, in a modern folk style." Numerous other critics have praised her, and she has been called "extraordinary" and "a rare person who can convey deep feelings with spontaneity as well

State Bishops Set Meeting In N.Y. City

Washington, D.C. (RNS) — Roman Catholic bishops of the 12 regions of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops (NCCB) will hold their annual Spring meetings in late April and early May, according to the NCCB's general secretariat here. In announcing the dates and places for the meetings, most of which will last three days, the NCCB secretariat said the topic for 1974 sessions will be "The Use of Modern Means of Communication as Instruments of Evangelization."

Discussion material is being prepared by the Communications Department of the U.S. Catholic Conference.

The Region II (New York State) meeting will be April 28-May 1 at New York, N.Y. with Cardinal Terence Cooke of New York.

Theme music composed by Chuck Mangione is sung by Esther Satterfield. The film, entitled *As Long as We're Together*, won a CINE Golden Eagle and the Chris Statuette Award at the Columbus International Film Festival.

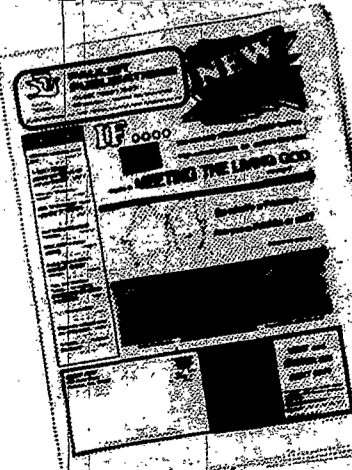
