## Thanksgiving Collection: 16 M Pounds

New York [RNS] — When processing is completed, the 1973 Thanksgiving clothing appeal by Catholic Relief Services will result in the collection of an estimated 16 million pounds of clothing, blankets, bedding and footwear, it was reported here.

At the end of January, the CRS main processing depot in New York City had already checked in almost 10 million pounds with another 3 million expected by the end of April. Plants in Milwaukee and Seattle have reported close to 4 million pounds accumulated.

Edward M. Kinney, official in charge of U.S. bishops' agency's nationwide appeal, said the total value of the 1973 collection is estimated to be more than \$25 million. Shipments from the materials collected have already been made to 33 countries from Brazil to Zaire.
