BASH
An Unusual Way
To Raise Funds
For High School

It seems unlikely that a \$100-a-couple cocktail party, gourmet dinner, art show and auction would be a means of raising money for a high school, but that's what the promoters of McQuaid Jesuit High School's BASH (Building a Scholastic Heritage) are hoping to accomplish.

In fact, they've set for themselves a goal of raising \$80,000 on the evening, which takes place March 30, beginning at 4:30 in the school gymnasium.

Father John J. McDonald, SJ, rector-president of McQuaid, explained at a March 6 press conference that his school receives no state, local or diocesan assistance, and must look to innovative methods like BASH for fund-raising.

"It's the price of independence," he said.

Though nothing like BASH has ever been attempted in the Rochester area before, he claimed, "we (the Jesuits) have tried it in 20 of our schools around the country, and have had much success."

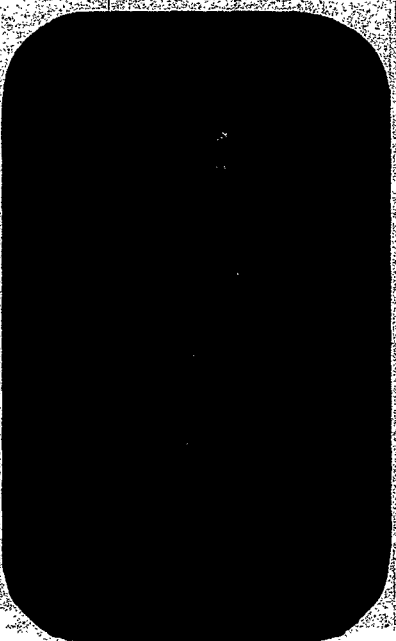
Preparation for BASH has been going on for four months. Gift solicitation for the auction is almost complete, and nearly 200 couples (250 is the limit) have purchased tickets.

Items for auction include a yearling horse, a week's vacation for two in Bermuda, use of a condominium for a week in Aspen, Colo., scholarships to St. John Fisher and Nazareth Colleges, and many appliances.

In conjunction with BASH, Lincoln First Bank will hold an art exhibit of some 50 donated pieces during the week of March 25-30. Those art objects not sold at the exhibit will be auctioned off at BASH.

Father McDonald admitted that there might seem to some an element of "snobbery" in BASH, but added that the result, funds for McQuaid, will excuse the method of raising them.

"Basically, we are appealing to those people who have the means for sharing," he said.

One thing that he is afraid has "scared some people off" is the \$100 admission to BASH. "Many people don't realize that \$50 will be given back to them as scrip to be used in the auction," he said.

He was enthusiastic about the cooperation BASH has received from all involved. "Everything is going to be first-rate," he said. "One committee is working exclusively on decorations (BASH's theme will be 'Night of Knights'). The students will provide valet parking. A catalogue of all items for auction will be mailed a week ahead of time."

Money raised from BASH will go toward "keeping tuition within reach," and toward continuation and expansion of current McQuaid services, like the individualized mathematics program, the psychology lab, the Magis community service project, and Higher Achievement, which offers every summer six weeks of athletics, English, and mathematics for sixth grade boys from the inner city.
