Father Koob To Leave NCEA Post

Washington, D.C. [RNS] — The board of directors of the National Catholic Educational Association approved a recommendation that Father C. Albert Koob, O. Praem., NCEA president for the last seven years, leave his post June 30 because of injuries sustained in a 1972 accident.

In making the recommendation at a special board meeting (March 11), Msgr. James Habiger, superintendent of schools for the Winona, Minn. diocese and head of an NCEA ad hoc committee on functions and structures said he was doing so strictly because of injuries suffered by Father Koob and the "consequent impairment of his general health."

He said his committee offered the recommendation "with great reluctance," noting that Father Koob "has served the association in an exemplary fashion since his election in 1967. His achievements during his tenure as president are well documented and known to us all."

GeVa Theater To Reopen

GeVa Theater will light up again next week with three new productions in its repertoire.

A proclamation of GeVa Week will herald the return of the midtown players, who have been in rehearsal since early this month. They will resume their lunchtime, rush hour, evening and Saturday matinee performances with a total of 15 plays.

Cost Increase Boosts Nazareth Tuition, Board

Nazareth College will increase its tuition and room and board a total of \$150 for the 1974-75 academic year. It will also raise its fees for Continuing Education and graduate students \$5 per credit hour beginning in summer session.

In letters to students and parents announcing the increases, Dr. Alice L. Foley, president, said that the Board of Trustees "reluctantly" approved the new fee schedule "in light of the unprecedented increase in the costs of all goods and services to the college."

Tuition for full time undergraduate students will be increased from \$2,100 to \$2,200 per year. Room and Board will go from \$1,300 to \$1,350 per year.

Undergraduate courses in continuing education will cost \$55 per credit hour and graduate courses \$65 per credit hour. All other fees will remain the same.

Memorial Gallery Hosts Four Shows

Recent work by Peter Berg and Bill Stewart, the two top prize-winners in last year's Finger Lakes show, will be among four exhibitions opening March 30 at the Memorial Art Gallery of the University of Rochester.

Berg will be represented by paintings, prints and drawings in a style that has been described as "magic realism," reflecting, in his own words, "themes of football, lions, close friends, and members of my immediate family."

Stewart's work, represented in numerous college and private

collections, consists of "ceramic fantasies" — brightly glazed cows, crocodiles, crab-men, rooster-men, frog-ladies, dinosaurs, turtles, skeletons, snails, "very nice snakes" and assorted monsters.

Other exhibits for April are a selection of photographic prints and slides from the Rochester International Salon of Photography; "Places for People," a show given by the Rochester Landmark Society; and contemporary Roumanian prints, circulated by the government of Roumania.
