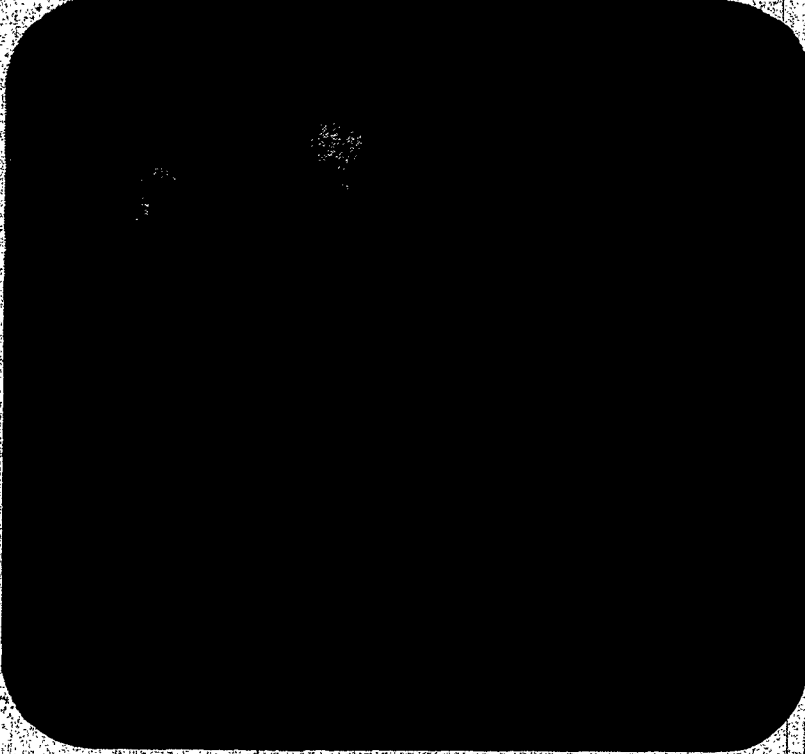
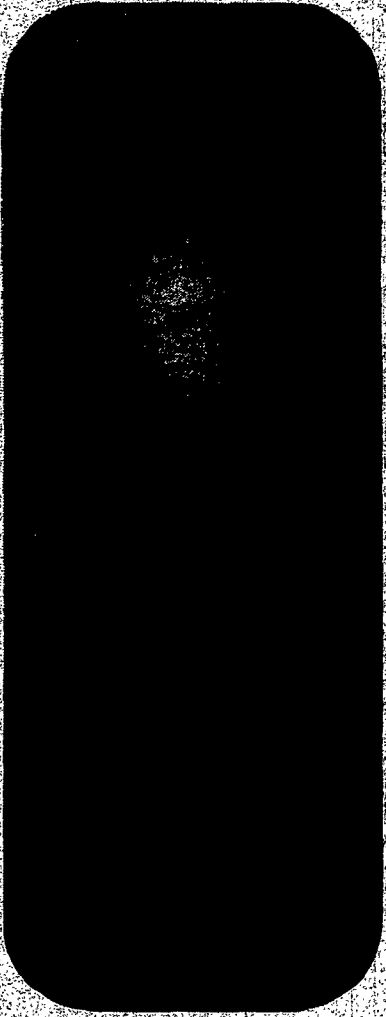
A highlight of the evening was the presentation of money to charitable organizations and special citations to individuals and organizations working with the Knights and their programs.

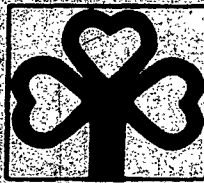
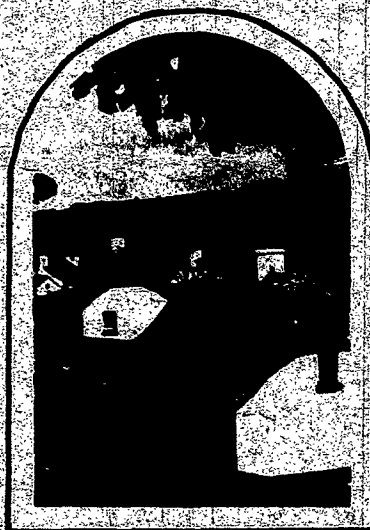

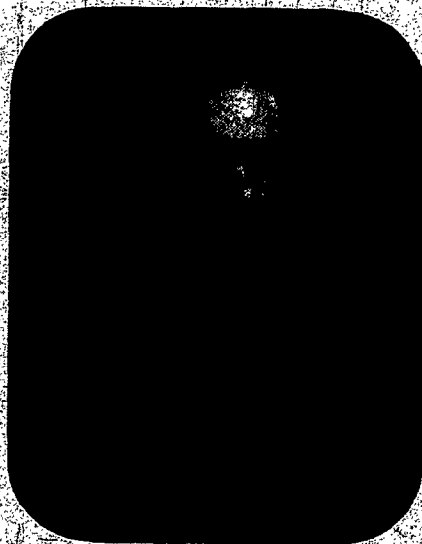


Spring Tour to Ireland
