

Way of The Cross In Brockport

Brockport's own version of the famous Oberammergau dramatic Easter presentation took place on Wednesday evening, April 3. At dusk, all of the students from Nativity B.V.M. School, the principal, teachers, and parents and friends joined the priests in the Nativity Church. There began the procession portraying Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The procession, with all the children in costumes, and with even a donkey to make the event come alive, paraded down Monroe Avenue and Utica Street to the school playground. The children and all who followed the procession joined in the singing.

Once the group reached the school playground on Holley and Utica streets, the actual re-enactment of the Passion began. Father John Philipps, pastor, began the recitation of the Stations of the Cross. Children from the school and some from CCD classes portrayed the entire event. The stations were tableaux made up by the costumed children. At the 15th station, The Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus, all proceeded back to the church following the same route and singing joyous hymns, proclaiming our faith to all.

The celebration, planned by teachers Robert Edelman and Janice Reding, with the advice and encouragement given by Father John Philipps and Sister Carole Proia, principal, involved a great deal of work by all of the students and staff, the priests, and by many parents who cooperated in the making of props and costumes.
