Painted Post is only a mile away, so about 3:30 I met with my classmate, Father Harold Rogers, for a congenial half hour, recalling our classmates, and discussing the hopes of the Church. Then onward to the north. At 6 p.m. I blew into the kitchen at Penn Yan, thinking supper had been at 5:30, and intending only the companionship of brother priests and a cup of coffee. The parish secretary, Mrs. Ruth Morris, whose son is a priest of the Oblates of St. Francis DeSales, was substituting for Evelyn, who is a good cook and an expert bowler. "Supper at 5:30" turned out to be a substantial "dinner at 6:30."

Father McVeigh, the pastor, presides at table beaming but quiet. His assistants have all been talkative, and Father Ryan is no exception. He praised Bishop Sheen's Retreat tapes, and arranged to pick up another set from me. (N.B. I keep extra sets on hand for emergencies.) He enthused about a new book: "I Will Be Called John" by Lawrence Elliott, saying: "Lawrence is a non-Catholic, and was commissioned by the Readers Digest to write an article about Pope John. He became so taken up by the Pope that he continued his research and came out with the book. I think you would like the book as much as you do the Sheen tapes." With such a recommendation I certainly will get the book, even at \$10.

Like much vaunted Liberty, what terrible things have been

done in the name of Pope John! His own autobiography, Journal of a Soul, quite belies the betrayals progressive Yahoos have inflicted on the Church in the name of Pope John and aggiornamento. Will Herberg recently wrote: "Aggiornamento aggressively advanced under the alleged patronage of Vatican II, has, in fact, become the signal for an open season on the Church."

Perhaps the most shocking manifestations of the disintegration of the Catholic faith and of the religio-cultural Gestalt it represents, is to be found on the campuses of so-called Catholic colleges and universities of this country, all in the name of aggiornamento. "We live in great days when we have to turn to the Jewish philosopher, Will Herberg, for a good critical analysis of false aggiornamento, and the Protestant Elliot Lawrence for an authentic presentation of Pope John."

After dinner my guardian angel whispered: "You haven't seen Father Paul Murley in ages." So onward to Victor. Father M. was busy giving instructions, but my joy was complete because a Legion of Mary meeting was in session, which I joined. The Legionnaires are using the Sheen tapes for shut-ins, adult education and their own spiritual growth. However, Mrs. Barry is a registered nurse, and she opined: "The tapes are great; but for the sick and the aged they are long and require too much concentration. Are there shorter tapes we could use?" The MAGNIFY THE LORD radio program can be made into cassettes. It is sponsored by the Hornell Legion. It is only 15 minutes, and has variety: music, devotional message, prayers. Also, Father Lew Brown has an attractive Father Brown's Sunday School which also could be used. "That sounds like what we want. Can you get us some cassettes?" Of course. And these might be useful in other places. Soon Father Murley came bounding in. He gave a nice talk on Our Lady, and the meeting concluded. Fr. M. and I went up stairs and chatted for half an hour.

It was a good finale to the 34-hour trip.
