Funeral Mass for Sister Ann Catherine Socha of the Sisters of St. Joseph was celebrated April 24, 1974, at the Motherhouse by Father Joseph Reinhart. Among those attending were Msgr. William Naughton and Fathers Donald J. Murphy, Matthew Siudara, and Chester Kloczek.

Sister Ann Catherine was principal of St. Stanislaus School in Rochester, 1947-53 and of St. Casimir School, Elmira, 1953-58. She had taught in St. Casimir's School, Elmira, for a total of 27 years. Illness caused her retirement in 1962.

Born in Rochester, Sister entered the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1922 from St. Stanislaus Parish. She earned the New York State permanent teaching certificate from the training school of her order, and a bachelor degree in education from Nazareth College.

Surviving is one sister, Mrs. Lillian Okolowicz of Rochester.

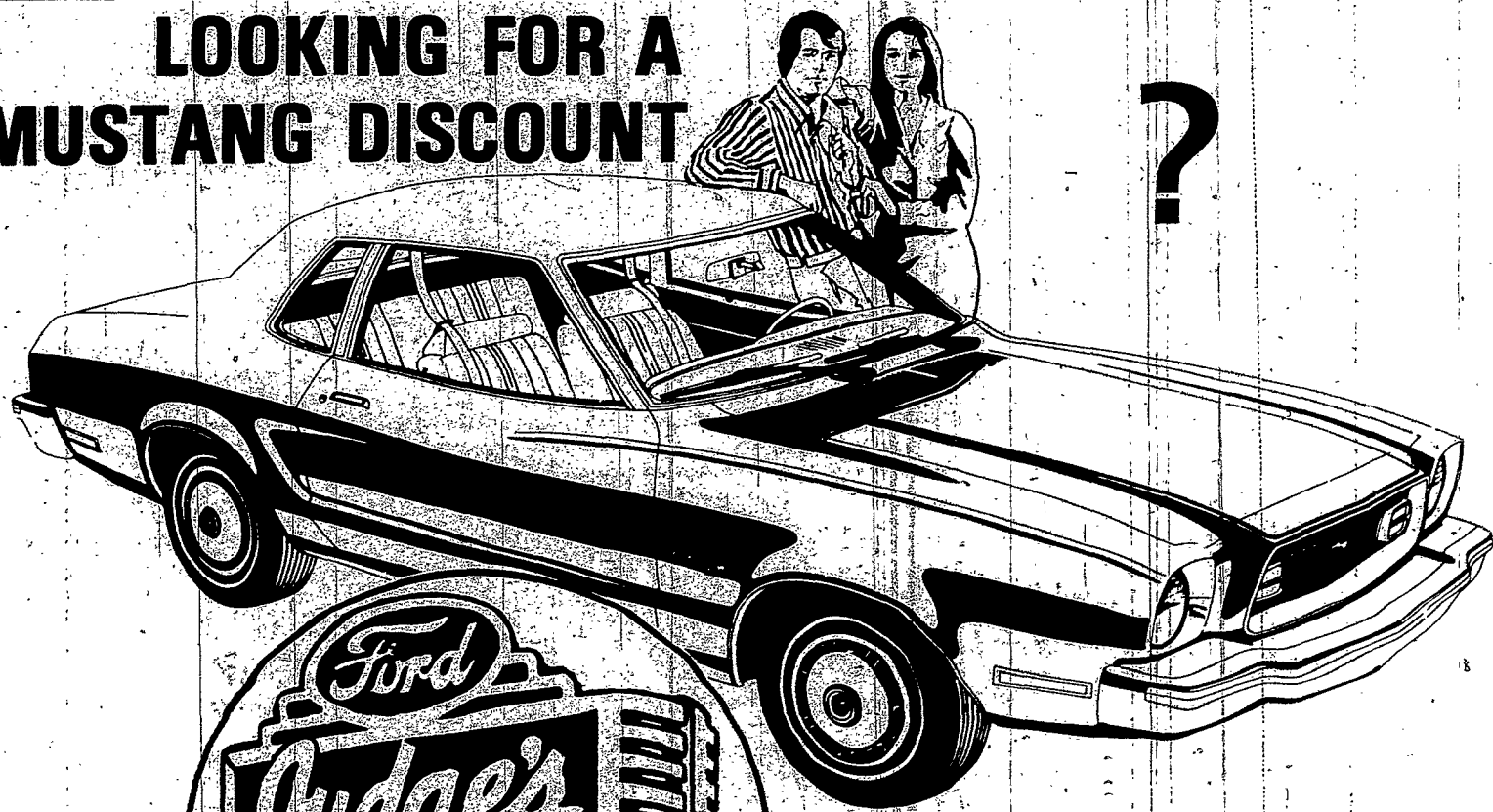
