Interfaith Unit Assails Terrorist Raid on Israel

The executive committee of the Rochester Interfaith Committee on Israel has called on all Americans to urge congressmen and senators to press for State Department action against governments which harbor and condone terrorists.

Former Rochester mayor Stephen May is chairman of the committee which includes Father Joseph P. Brennan, rector at St. Bernard's Seminary, Rabbi Judea Miller and the Rev. Carl Smith.

In a statement condemning the recent terrorist raids on Kiryat Shmona, Israel, the committee said, "All men of good will everywhere are appalled by the senseless slaughter of innocent civilians whose only fault was that they happened to be Jews."

"The incident," said the statement, "is particularly regrettable since it came a time when the processes of peace are in motion."
