Trial Begins On Thefts

Vatican City [RNS] — Four former Vatican employes, three of them telephone exchange operators, went to trial here on charges of stealing medals and other precious objects from Pope Paul's private apartments.

Vatican Radio said the thefts, which took place between 1968 and 1971, may have included some "priceless paintings." Total

value of the stolen objects was not announced.

The broadcast emphasized that this is the first case "in living memory" involving theft of the Pope's property.
