"Some might feel that the number of the votes (75 for 5:30 and 49 for 7:30) might indicate that a number of our people did not bother to vote." Chairman Smith observed. "As a matter of fact, the committee considers that the size of the vote indicates that our people followed a suggestion that we made: For we

had suggested that for purposes of obtaining the true feelings of the people only those who would be affected by the decision should cast a ballot."

Msgr. John F. Duffy, pastor of Saint Catherine's, suggested that the change in schedule take place on the first weekend on June. "In this way," Msgr. Duffy indicated, "we will have the opportunity of giving the people sufficient advance notice."
