Hillside Center Elects Woman

Mrs. James F. Mangan of 439 Allens Creek Road has been elected president of the Board of Directors of Hillside Children's Center. She is the first woman to hold that position since 1949.

Beginning in 1837, Hillside Children's Center had always been governed by an all-women Board of Managers, while men served as Trustees. In 1949, the

men's and women's boards merged, and since then 11 men have been elected presidents.
