

Father Hart Leaving Aquinas RIT Names Nazzaro Teacher of the Year

Father Leon G. Hart, CSB, who has been at Aquinas Institute almost continuously throughout the 20 years of his priesthood, has been transferred to the Basilians' Assumption High School in Windsor, Ont. He will be vice principal.

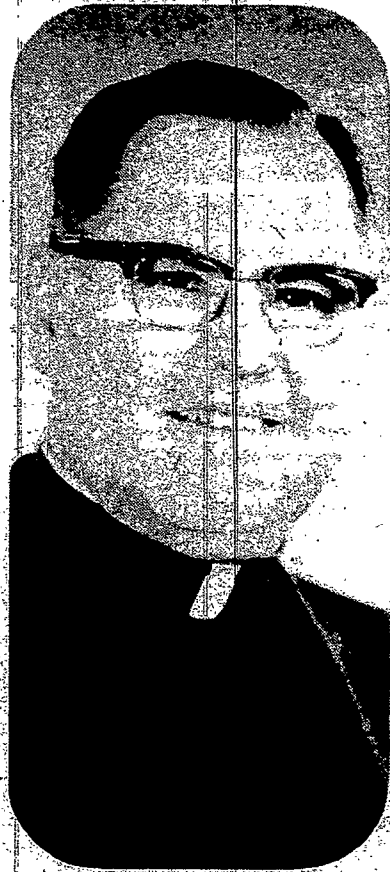
By appointment effective June 29, he will take over from Father Robert Chauvin, a former longtime member of the Aquinas staff, who has been at the Windsor school for the past three years. Father Chauvin's health has limited his activity of late, Father Hart reported.

Moving to Assumption is "particularly interesting" to the Rochester priest because of its differences from Aquinas. The school, which accommodates male boarders as well as day students, went co-educational

three years ago. Grades 9 and 10 draw financial support from the Windsor Separate School Board, "which will be a completely new experience for me; it's fairly new for them," Father Hart said.

He spent 1970-1971 on special duty with the diocesan education office, trying to promote the kind of political and popular support that might lead to such government aid to Catholic education in the United States.

He is a graduate of the University of Toronto, holds a Master of Education degree from the University of Rochester and had done graduate work also at Catholic University, Wayne State, and the University of Detroit. He was ordained in 1953 in Toronto, and since 1959 has been a weekend assistant at his home parish, St. Charles Borromeo.

At Aquinas, Father Hart has served over the years as teacher, vice principal, principal and director of public relations and development. Born and brought up in Greece, he also was a student at the Dewey Avenue school, 1940-1944.

"I leave regretfully," he said, "but I realize that a little new blood could do a lot of things for both schools."

Dr. Pelegrino Nazzaro, professor and chairman of the history academic committee, was recently named Rochester Institute of Technology's Outstanding Teacher of the Year.

The title is the most distinguished award presented by RIT to its faculty.

The award was given to Dr. Nazzaro "in recognition of his conspicuous success as a teacher, his devotion to the intellectual development of students and the respect and confidence in which he is held by the institute community."

Dr. Nazzaro was born and educated in Italy. He received his doctorate in History and Law from the University of Naples.

As a member of Italy's Christian Democratic party he worked at local and provincial levels in the Bureau of

Propaganda and Studies (SPES) from 1950 to 1961. He taught in Italian state colleges for seven years before accepting a teaching position in the United States.

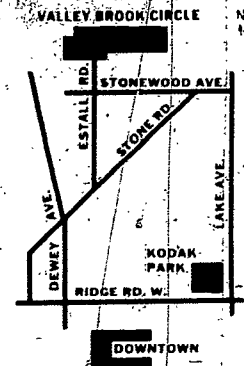
