

# Ministry Education Summer Program

The Responding Church, a program in ministry education, will be available to laity, Sisters and priests of the diocese this summer.

Sponsored by the Diocesan Sisters Council (DSC) the program will consist of mini-sessions at St. Ambrose School, 31 Empire Blvd., on weekday evenings throughout July.

Mini-session topics will include marriage counseling, ministry to the elderly, youth, prisoners, unwed parents, hospitals, persons in minority groups, the parish as community and as educator, the Holy Year, the role of women and migrants.

Sessions will be conducted by persons in the diocese working in these areas.

According to the DSC, the purpose is to enable those attending to understand better the range of human needs and gifts, to meet others with similar concerns, to come in contact with resource persons and to learn how to be a part of the healing process and realize that the Church here through its members is responding to needs with a variety of gifts.

The opening session, July 1 from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. at St. Ambrose, is free and open to everyone, regardless of whether they enroll for the entire program. It will feature speakers, a panel discussion and a videotape and its purpose is to acquaint those present with the program's content.

Program registration will take place afterward. Tickets will be sold in blocks of 12 for \$10. Each ticket admits one person to one session. Admittance to any session without a ticket is \$1 at the door.

The DSC suggests that parish councils buy one or more blocks of tickets and then divide them among members according to their interest.
