Natural Family Planning is frequently confused with calendar rhythm. Natural Family Planning represents an effective, natural alternative to other methods of family planning. It includes the Sympto-Thermic method and the Ovulation method and combinations of the two which will be discussed at this conference.

Refreshments will be served and there will be no admission charge. This program is sponsored by the Office of Family Life of the Diocese of Rochester.




