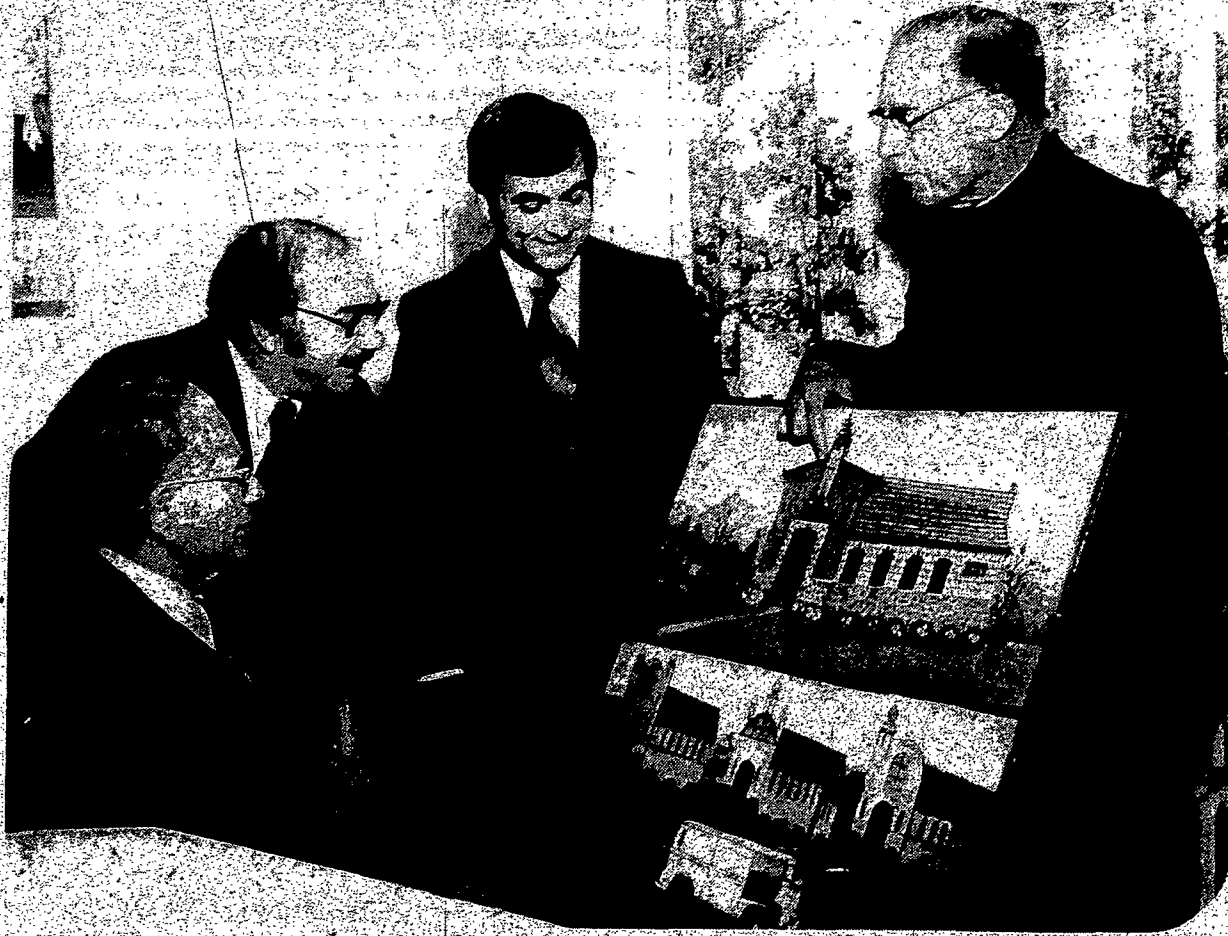

St. Francis Helps Missions

Father Nacca Celebrates 25 Years as Pastor

Auburn — St. Francis of Assisi Parish will hold open house Sunday afternoon, June 30, to celebrate the 25th anniversary of Father John J. Nacca's pastorate.

Father Nacca will offer a High Mass at 11:15 a.m. The reception will be from 3 until 6 p.m. in the school hall, 185 Clark St.

The pastor has served St. Francis since July 5, 1949. He had been an assistant here earlier, on his first assignment after ordination in June, 1941. A Rochesterian, Father Nacca attended grammar school at Holy Rosary and is a graduate of Aquinas Institute and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries.

The present church, the school building and the outdoor shrine dedicated to Our Lady of Lourdes all were constructed during his administration.

Lately, Father Nacca and his parishioners have been putting together money for the poorest missions abroad. Their achievement in little more than a year adds up to four churches and
