

# Unorthodoxy Hit at Wanderer Forum

St. Paul, Minn. [RNS] — "Unorthodox" theologians and "complacent" bishops drew fire from speakers who addressed the 10th National Wanderer Forum here.

Archbishop Robert J. Dwyer, retired head of the Portland, Ore. archdiocese, charged that some theologians are questioning or ignoring the teaching authority of the Roman Catholic Church.

Father Paul Auer, pastor of St. Mary's Catholic Church, Anacortes, Wash., denounced theologians who discredit Church authority and called on bishops to do more to protect the Church from false teaching.

The forum at which they spoke

was sponsored by The Wanderer, national Catholic weekly published in St. Paul. "The Obedience of Faith" was the theme.

In the keynote address, Archbishop Dwyer said the Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation, promulgated by the Second Vatican Council, is "an eminently conservative statement" but some theologians are "willing and even apparently eager to ignore its teaching and defy its plain structures."

"Modernism, that compendium of all the errors, is indeed being revived, alive and doing well. The Church is conceived, not as that institution

founded by Christ upon the Rock of Peter himself, the sole accredited teacher of men and nations in matters of revealed doctrine and of morality, but as a sort of glorified debating society, possessing certain spiritual or traditional amenities, but in no serious sense the very voice and body of Christ the Lord," he said.

He emphasized that "Modernism, doctrinal relativism, Teilhardian evolutionism are the hang-ups and fixations of a relatively small but lustily vocal minority" among theologians.

"Nevertheless," Archbishop Dwyer added, "the harm this minority, clever, persuasive and seemingly unscrupulous in its

manipulation of minds and data, has succeeded in inflicting on the Church, largely through the medium of a press nominally Catholic but actually in cordial sympathy with the new modernism, is incalculable.

"Once upon a time the Christian world woke up and groaned to find itself Arian. Will the same trauma be in store for the Catholic world of our time? **Quod avertat Deus!**"

In a sermon during a Pontifical High Mass at St. Agnes Church, Father Auer spoke on "The Grave Duty of Theologians to Defend Truth."

He said a bishop is "com-

placent" when he "entrusts his apostolic commission as the voice of orthodoxy" to his "experts."

And he asked:

"How complacent can a national conference of bishops be, having turned over the national religious education program to a USCC (United States Catholic Conference) department by almost unanimous vote?

"Is this the meaning of collegiality? — when those whose unique office is the voice of orthodoxy merely turn over that role to subordinates whose office directives become national policy almost automatically?"
