Mercy Sisters Call for 'Unconditional Amnesty'

Bethesda, Md. — The ninth General Chapter of the Sisters of Mercy of the Union, meeting here last week, adopted a statement calling for "universal and unconditional amnesty for violators of the Selective Service Act."

"The rationale for our position emerges primarily from a commitment to religious values, and also from a recognition of the fundamental needs of the United States," the statement said.

The Sisters further noted, "As women of the Church we support Pope Paul's call for amnesty. We join in a united voice with him to proclaim the Gospel message of reconciliation and mercy. That Gospel message mandates a forgetfulness of the transgressions of the human law by some men, so that they could obey the higher law of conscience. We respect the decision of those who chose to serve, yet we uphold with equal conviction the thousands who could not justify such action.

"We affirm the centuries old religious principle of an individual's moral right to refuse participation in a particular war in which the claims of the government and those of his conscience conflict. Congress and the courts have steadfastly refused to provide for 'selective conscientious objection.' This failure, a major reason for the moral crisis of tens of thousands,

could be righted by the extension of amnesty."

The Sisters said, "Amnesty would demonstrate that America is still capable of a communal moral act. It is ironic that we continue to treat those of our young generation who refused to fight in the war as the 'new enemy.' A spirit of humanity will stand this nation in good stead as it makes peace with the world and with itself."

SCHOOL BOARD


