## Kodak Grants \$350,000 To Nazareth College

Nazareth College of Rochester's drive for funds to construct a college community center received a substantial assist last week in the form of a \$350,000 special capital grant from Eastman Kodak Company. The goal of the college's 50th anniversary capital fund drive is \$3,750,000.

The announcement was made by Dr. Alice L. Foley, Nazareth president, who reported that pledges totaling over \$1,520,000, or 41 per cent, have now been received from the corporate and special gift phase of the drive still in progress. General solicitation will begin Aug. 1.

The Kodak grant was termed by Dr. Foley "further evidence of

Kodak's continuing support of worthy community projects and quality higher education. Kodak's Educational Aid Program has long served as a model for corporations throughout the country.

"We are grateful," she said, "that Kodak has endorsed both the educational and community service objectives of our proposed center in such a generous manner."

The new center will incorporate three major segments: a college commons, including a student union, an interfaith religious center and a life activities and physical education building.

## Deaths

### Dr. J. R. Kelly

A Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated at St. Ann's Church, Hornell, July 23 for Dr. J. Raymond Kelly, long time area physician and father of four physician sons, who died in his sleep July 20, 1974, at his home. He was 86.

Dr. Kelly began his medical practice in Hornell in 1912. He graduated from Hornell High School in 1905 and from the University of Pennsylvania in 1910. Long associated with St. James Mercy Hospital, he was a past president of the hospital staff and also its board of directors. He had been the surgeon for the Erie Railroad, first serving in that capacity in 1912. His associations included: Membership in the American Medical Association; fellow in the International College of Surgeons; member of the Hornell Medical and Surgical Association, Steuben County and New York State Medical societies; New York and New England Railroad Surgeons' Association; past director of the Hornell Children's Home; Knights of Columbus, Elks and he was a parishioner of St. Ann's Church.

Dr. Kelly was married to the former Ora Eppler of Elmira who died in 1959. Surviving are a brother, William of Detroit, two sisters, Mrs. Daniel J. Meheer of Rochester and Mrs. J. Raymond Ottman of California; four sons, Drs. John and James of Hornell, Dr. William of Savannah, Ga., and Dr. Raymond of Schenectady; two daughters, Mrs. George Scrocco of Pearl River and Mrs. John Costello of Boston, and 28 grandchildren.

Participating in the funeral rites were Bishop Joseph L. Hogan and Fathers Michael Conboy, Paul Cuddy, Albert DelMonte, William Cosgrove, Herbert Sturmer, Robert MacNamara, and William Spilly.

### J. W. McCarthy

## BOCES 1 Gets Grant

A federal grant of \$89,000 has been awarded to BOCES 1 in eastern Monroe County to serve pre-school children with special needs and their parents through the combined efforts of classroom teachers, mental health workers, communication experts and researchers.

Open to pre-school children from three years of age in eastern Monroe and Wayne Counties and the City of Rochester, the program now is accepting referrals for September enrollment from agencies, pediatricians, school personnel and parents themselves. Enrollment may be discussed by contacting the Foreman Center in Fairport (377-4660).

The program will be based at Karlan School in Irondequoit, which has been leased by BOCES 1 through arrangement with the West Irondequoit school board. Altogether, 40 youngsters will be

accommodated, five attending each of four morning classes and an equal number in the afternoon. (Two of the classes are supported by an earlier federal grant under Title 6, which has been renewed each year since 1970).

The new funds will permit not only an intensive study of the social and emotional welfare of the pre-schoolers, but also will reach out to their parents, with regularly-scheduled discussions and conferences. Social workers, psychologists, speech and hearing therapists, nursing personnel and teachers will work both with the youngsters and their parents, as required.

In addition, the grant will support a survey to be undertaken in cooperation with pediatricians, agencies and schools to determine probable future needs of one and two-year-

olds in the metropolitan Rochester area.

Each class of five students will be guided by a specially trained teacher and her aide, who will keep activities and time-schedules flexible, adapting to the needs of the individual children. Bus transportation will be provided to and from the youngsters' homes.

The grant, awarded under Title 3 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, will be administered by the State Education Department.
