ing was worn and cracked. The new owner's sideby-side refrigerator/freezer had to be placed in the 6'x 11' breakfast room/butler's pantry between the kitchen and dining room.
In remodeling the kitch-

en, the owner retained the country English feeling of the rest of the house.

For efficiency, most of the equipment was ranged along one wall. A brick niche and "chimney" house a planning desk and selfcleaning electric wall oven. Then come a dishwasher, sink, and gas cooktop. The doors beneath the sink have mesh panels to permit drying air around dishtowels.


