Papal Delegate Lauds U.S. Church as Efficient

Buffalo (RNS) — Archbishop Jean Jadot, apostolic delegate in the U.S., sees the Catholic Church in the United States as "a very living Church, very efficient, very effective and with deep cooperation existing among its hierarchy, priests and laity."

He made this observation while here for the Retreats International Convention held on the campus of Canisius College.

At a banquet closing the convention, the archbishop said: "I felt the presence of the Holy Spirit in your work. I believe in your movement. You should emphasize the responsibility that Catholics must have for others in the world. Preach Christ to all men, all over the world, rich and poor and all colors and creeds."


Later, in an interview, Archbishop Jadot commented on folk Masses by saying it is quite normal for young and old alike to express themselves in this form, adding: "One of the pitfalls of this type of Mass is that participants may begin to follow their own inspiration but not those of Christ. We must remember that prayer is always an answer to the call of God and if you don't listen, the response may be different from what God is asking of you."

Asked if he thought "face-to-face confession" in the Catholic Church would become a universal practice, the Pope's representative in the U.S. said he would be surprised to see this form become a general practice.
