Blacks Remember Garvey

The man who was known as the "back to Africa" advocate was commemorated during the Marcus Garvey Memorial Black Solidarity Week Aug. 11-17. Various organizations in the black community organized the week's events as a sign of "unity," according to Kimba, office manager of the central headquarters for the week.

Marcus Mozhiah Garvey, 1887-1940, originally a Jamaican printer's apprentice, is best

known for his campaign to send American blacks back to Africa. He believed that blacks would never receive justice in countries where most of the people were white.

Garvey founded the Universal Negro Improvement Association (UNIA) whose goals were to promote unity and acquire economic power.

In 1922 he announced the Empire of Africa and made himself provisional president. Kimba believes, however, that Garvey did not mean a movement in a literal sense, but wanted blacks to return to Africa culturally.

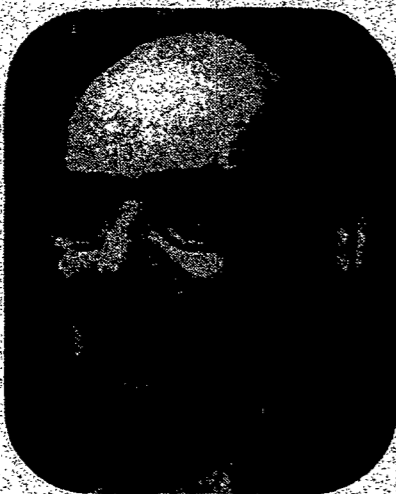
Opponents of Garvey denounced him for his poor business methods and his doctrine of racial purity and separatism.

Kimba praised the black nationalist as one "who has done more for black unity than any other individual." Sponsoring this drive for unity included Fight Urban League, Action for a Better Community, the Educational Opportunity Center, Baden Street Settlement, Emikago, the A. Philip Randolph Organization, M.A.M.G.U.T. (Marcus and Malcolm (X) Got Us Together) and the Women's Welfare Organization.

AFSC AID

Philadelphia [RNS] — The delivery of \$32,587 in medical equipment and supplies to the Viet Duc Hospital in Hanoi was announced here by the American Friends Service Committee (AFSC). Three representatives of the Quaker organization also took \$10,131 in medical supplies for rural clinics to the region of South Vietnam controlled by the Provisional Revolutionary Government (Viet Cong).

Pope Appoints Two Bishops

Washington, D.C. [RNS] — Pope Paul has named Auxiliary Bishop Joseph V. Sullivan of Kansas City-St. Joseph, Mo., to be Bishop of Baton Rouge, La., and Msgr. Kenneth A. Angell, chancellor of the Providence, R.I., diocese, to be auxiliary bishop of Providence.

Bishop Sullivan, 55, was ordained a bishop in 1967. He will succeed Bishop Robert Tracy of Baton Rouge, who resigned last March. Bishop-designate Angell, 44, becomes auxiliary to Bishop Louis E. Gelineau.

Both appointments were announced here by Archbishop Jean Jadot, Apostolic Delegate in the U.S.
