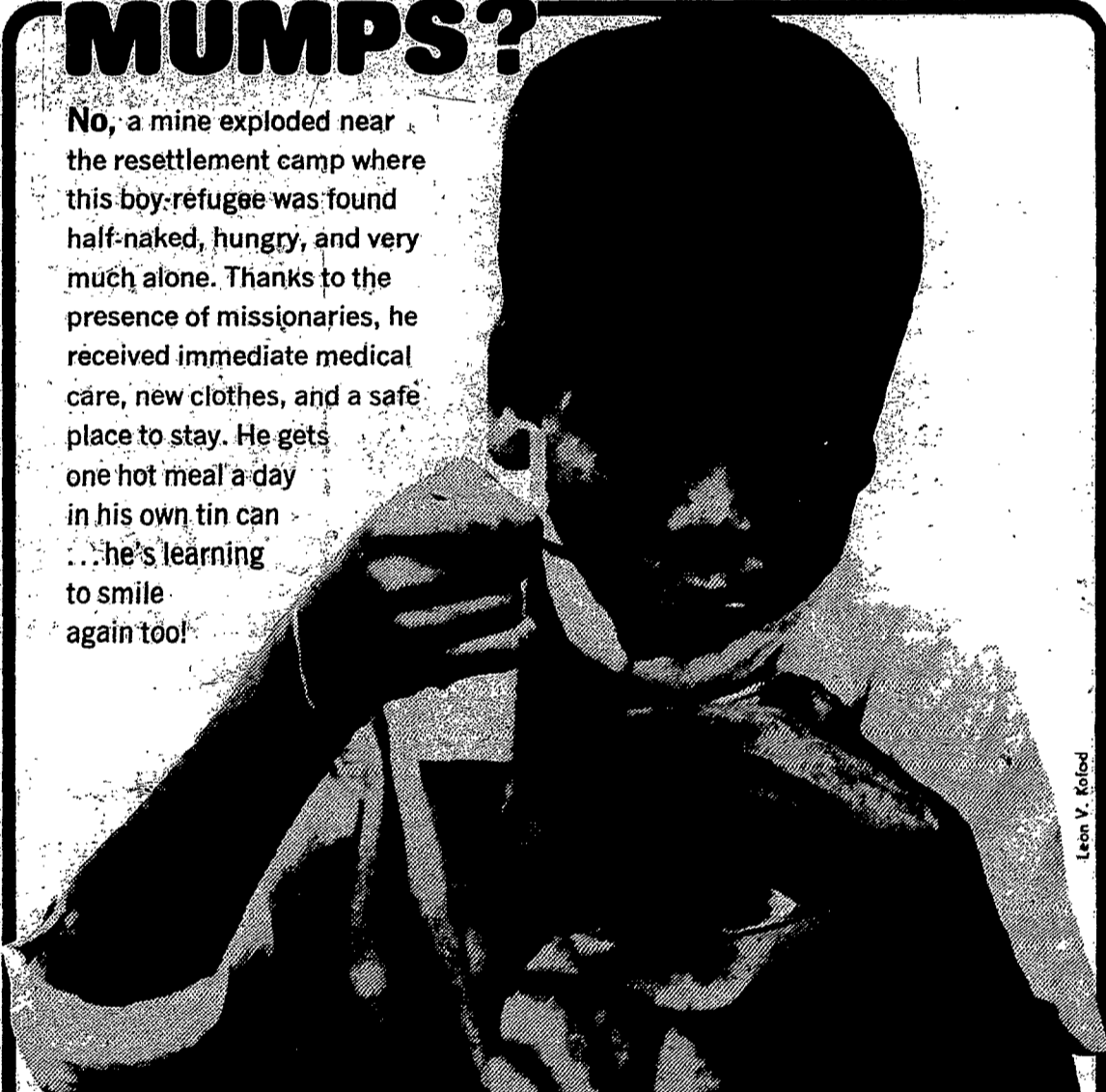
St. Mary's School Appoints Faculty
