Brother Collins

Brother John A. Collins, CFC, of Bishop Kearney High School, died of a heart attack Aug. 25, 1974, in Monticello, N.Y.

He was 43 years old, and 25 years a member of the Congregation of Christian Brothers.

The Mass of Christian Burial was offered yesterday in Christ the King Church. Burial will take place tomorrow at his order's novitiate in West Park, N.Y., after a wake at All Hallows High School in the Bronx.

Brother Collins was chairman of the English department at Kearney, business manager of the school and moderator of its Fathers Club and National Honor Society chapter.

A native of New York, he attended Rice High School there, after early education in Kerry, Ireland. He held a master's degree in English from Gonzaga University, Spokane.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Collins, live in the Bronx. Other survivors are his brothers, Joseph Collins, a lay teacher at Kearney, and Father William Collins of New York.

Funeral services for Sister Lorenzo O'Brien of the Sisters of St. Joseph were held Aug. 19, 1974, at the Motherhouse.

Father William Gordinier concelebrated the Mass with Fathers James Doyle, Robert Miller and Joseph Reinhart. Also present were Msgr. William Naughton and Father Frederick Walz.

Sister Lorenzo served in the Diocese for fifty years. She was a teacher and bookkeeper for several years in the old diocesan home for boys and later was a floor supervisor for more than 20 years in the Lake Avenue home for the aged that preceded the present St. Ann's Home. In 1965 she came to St. Joseph Convent Infirmary to help care for the sick. Illness forced her retirement in 1970.

At the time of her entrance to the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1918, her home was in Warsaw, N.Y. While working in Rochester she lived in Blessed Sacrament Parish.

Sr. Mary Elaine

Sister Mary Elaine Justino, SSJ, who worked with the displaced children of St. Joseph's Villa for 32 years, died Aug. 20, 1974, after an illness of several months. She was 62 years old.

The funeral was held last Friday at the Motherhouse chapel.

Sister Mary Elaine was born March 5, 1912, in Lyons. She entered the congregation in 1933 and began her life work at St. Mary's Boy's Home, a forerunner of the Villa.

"She ran her own little after-care service," a colleague reported. "So many of her boys returned to visit her, to share their successes, their problems and their hopes, and to name their

children after her. And she never tired of offering whatever counseling she thought necessary."

A sister, Mrs. Jane Guignardi of Bedford Hills survives, with nieces, nephews and several cousins.

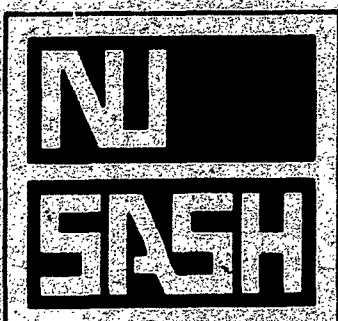

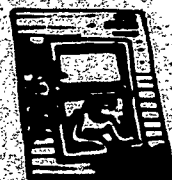
