**Braille Groups Offer Classes**

Unpaid work that is "difficult and time consuming" was offered this week to men and women of the Rochester area by the Volunteer Braille Groups.

Pointing out that nearly all brailled material is produced by volunteers, the groups set about their annual recruitment of new members to assure a continuing flow of books for the blind. Courses in transcription begin this month at four locations and will continue into the Spring, with one daytime class each week,

plus homework.

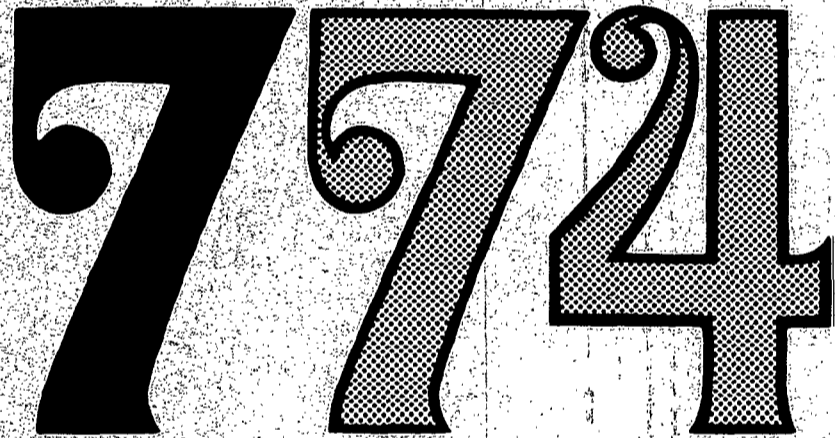
**Religious Dissent In Soviet Union To Be Discussed**
