Reading Experts Set Conference

How to capitalize on the relationship between teacher competence and pupil reading achievement will be explored by a team of nationally recognized reading authorities at the Rochester International Reading Association's Fall Conference, Saturday, Sept. 21 at Brighton High School.

The keynote address will be given by Dr. Grayce Ransom of the University of Southern California, and will be open to the general public.

This will be followed by two sessions on topics of interest to elementary and secondary teachers, specialists and administrators, and the interested public.

During each session, six concurrently running seminars and an exhibit of books and teacher-made materials will be options for those attending the conference.

The major speakers, including Dr. Ransom, will be Dr. Carl Smith, chairman of the Reading Center Program at Indiana University; and Dr. Frank Smith, Professor of Education at Ontario Institute for Studies in Education, University of Toronto.

Other speakers include Thomas Fitzgerald and Paula Rollins, Bureau of Reading Education, State Education Department; Dr. Marjorie Lehman, Supervisor of Reading, and Dr. Harold Bowman, Director of Curriculum, Greece Central School District; and Dr. Achille DeBerardinis, Director of Reading, Rush-Henrietta Central School.

The conference will begin at 8:30 a.m. and will close at 1 p.m.

Dinner to Mark Court Victory

The Rochester League of Women Voters and the Genesee Chapter of the Civil Liberties Union will give a dinner Friday, Sept. 20 at One Eleven East Avenue for the attorneys whose volunteer services won the landmark prisoner's voting rights decision before the United States Supreme Court. Charles Crimi, president of the Monroe County Bar Association, will speak.

The voting rights case was the first attempt of the Rochester league to solve a problem through litigation and the first time the local CLU lawyers had an opportunity to argue before the Supreme Court. The dinner also will mark the opening of the 1974 Voting Rights Service sponsored by the two organizations. 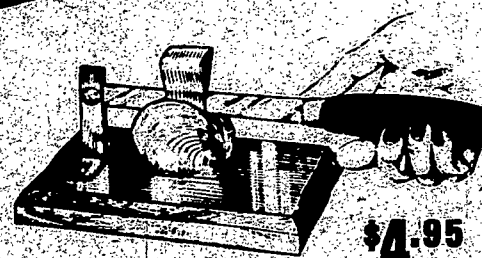

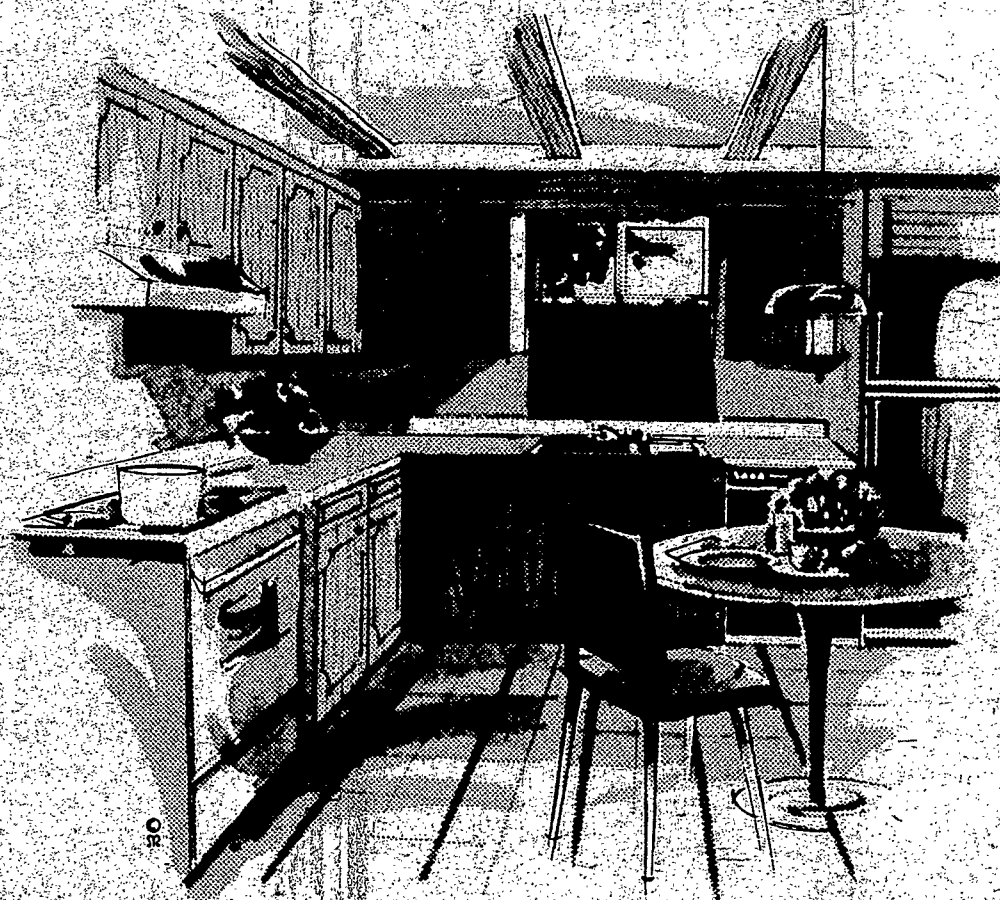
