Education Office Names Two

The Diocesan Department of Education has created the position of consultant for educational planning and appointed Padraic O'Hare of Queens to fill it. Sister James Lynch, coordinator of educational services, announced the appointment this week.

The consultant, she said, will help "challenge all forms to be true to their purpose" while affirming the essence of the teaching mission for each educational structure of the various parishes.

The new position, Sister James added, is part of the department's attempt to "decentralize the decision-making educational process." O'Hare will work with parish groups to chart their futures and establish their purpose, she said.

With masters degrees in religious studies and political science from Manhattan College and Fordham University, respectively, O'Hare received his doctorate in religion and education from Union Theological Seminary and Columbia University.

Most recently, he has been religious studies teacher at Mary Lewis Academy in New York City and lecturer in education at Kingsborough Community College of the City University of New York.

Previously he taught seventh grade at Our Lady of Angels, Brooklyn, and was chairman of the religious study program at St. Anthony's School, Smithtown, L.I. At St. Thomas College, he taught the "Philosophy of Person" and he was president of the diocesan council of high school religion teachers in Rockville County.

Intertwined with this teaching experience is his work in adult

religious education at a dozen parishes in the New York City area.

His face breaking into frequent smiles, O'Hare admits he is both philosophical and practical. His philosophy is simple. "To continue the ongoing humanization of the world and to spread the word of Jesus Christ," he said. On the practical level, O'Hare hopes to build cooperation with the people in the parishes and on the regional level.

After a month of orientation, O'Hare will concentrate his efforts on a single region yet to be named and assist each parish in it to discover "what they are about and where they are going." The young consultant plans to "emphasize service or ministry rather than jurisdiction."

The new position spans the two divisions of education and religious education which are under the general department. O'Hare will function in a "teaching role" with a "deep concern for visions and theological suppositions and a concern for a practical application."

O'Hare hopes not to be mistaken for an "answer man." His aim, he said, is to help each parish formulate its own planning process.

For Denise Mack, religious education has become a way of life.

As consultant for religious education coordinators, Mrs. Mack fills the vacancy left when Rosalie Reinhardt moved out of the diocese. Her position is one

on a five-person staff under the division of religious education.

"Nothing is more important or as effective as religious education," said Mrs. Mack, who hopes to extend it to include more adults.

"Parents are more concerned with their children's education than with their own. We have to make them realize that their children's education comes through them," she said.

Hanging on the wall in her office at the Pastoral Center is a quote which sums up her attitude towards her job: "Be assured over and over what people really want is inspiration, even though they keep asking for production."

Mrs. Mack plans to offer "inspiration" and consultative services by visiting each of the 72 religious education coordinators personally. "I want to share faith with them plus handle the nitty gritty problems," she said.

The consultant's duties include publication of the religious education newsletter and coordination of teacher training. Mrs. Mack noted that a major problem is teacher and coordinator recruitment. Five positions now are available for religious education coordinators.

Prior to her appointment, Mrs. Mack was responsible for adult education and teacher training at St. Ambrose Parish. She founded and directed the parish's pre-school program and was principal of the school of religion. She has been a teacher in the Irondequoit school system and has taught remedial reading for Xerox's high school equivalency program.
