Oasis of Faith' Ruined

The Redemptorists "oasis of faith in midtown" was built between 1843 and 1846 in a neighborhood of private homes and gardens. The parish itself was organized in 1836, 22 years before the establishment of the Diocese of Rochester, and the Franklin Street land was purchased by the founding pastor with money he solicited in Germany.

The beginning of St. Joseph's parish can be seen as an accident in that a break in the Erie Canal stalled a traveling German priest in Rochester.

Redemptorist Father Joseph Prost, on his way to Wisconsin in the Fall of 1835, and anxious to complete his trip before winter closed in, used the inconvenient delay to look up his fellow countrymen. Through St. Patrick's parish, he found that there-were about 700 German immigrants in this city of 12,000. He promised to return to them the following year. The German's organized meanwhile and bought a building from a Protestant congregation. The church was at Ely and Minerva, a corner that has disappeared under Lincoln Tower. Its basement housed the pastor and his school, the first parochial grammar school in the city.

The present church was dedicated July 26, 1846, before its original square tower had been erected. The graceful Late Renaissance tower designed by Joseph H. Oberlies, and the harmonizing facade, were completed in 1909.

Physical changes in the neighborhood have been accompanied by functional alterations in services provided by the Redemptorists. Seventeen years ago, when special permission still was required for the celebration of evening Mass, they inaugurated the daily 5:25 p.m.
