



ARCHBISHOP BYRNE DIES

Archbishop Coadjutor Leo C. Byrne of St. Paul-Minneapolis died Oct. 21 at his residence in St. Paul. Death was believed due to heart failure. He was 66 years old. Archbishop Byrne was appointed in 1967 as coadjutor archbishop with the right of succession to Archbishop Leo Binz and it was widely expected that he would become the leader of the archdiocese next year when Archbishop Binz will be 75. Archbishop Byrne was elected vice-president of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops in 1971, served as a delegate to the 1971 Synod of Bishops in Rome and was an alternate delegate to the 1974 Synod. **A Rockefeller On ND Board**

Notre Dame, Ind. [RNS] — John D. Rockefeller IV, president of Virginia Wesleyan College, and Dr. Percy A. Pierre dean of the School of Engineering at Howard University, have been elected trustees of the University of Notre Dame. Also elected a trustee was Jane P. Cahill, vice president for communications for International Business Machines. The new trustees bring membership on the board to seven priests and 32 lay persons. Following an unsuccessful bid for governor of West Virginia in 1972, Mr. Rockefeller became president of Wesleyan College in 1973. He graduated from Harvard with a degree in Far Eastern Languages and Oriental History.
