I support the proposal to merge the five existing trial courts into one Superior Court.

- A. Judges and auxiliary services could be more effectively utilized in areas with the heaviest caseloads.
- B. Overlapping jurisdiction of existing courts would be eliminated.
- C. All aspects of a single controversy could be resolved in one court.

2. Judges should be elected at the county level to bring the selection process closer to the people.
3. One judge should handle a case from start to finish. This would avoid duplication and result in speedier dispositions.
4. The biggest backlog of pending cases is now in the areas of criminal law and family law. Supreme Court Judges should take on more criminal cases and family problems to eliminate the long delays in these areas where individual rights are so vitally affected.
