Wide-Ranging Issues on Bishops' Agenda

Washington — The election of a new president and vice president, a proposed statement on capital punishment, and reports on a host of topics from the Holy Year to the forthcoming Eucharistic Congress in the United States, are on the agenda of the annual general meeting of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops (NCCB) and United States Catholic Conference (USCC).

Also on the agenda is a plan developed by a Task Force of the USCC Communication Committee to help implement recommendations of the 1974 Spring regional meetings of the NCCB on communication and evangelization.

Some 250 members of the Catholic hierarchy are expected to attend the meeting Nov. 18 to 22 at the Statler Hilton Hotel here.

Prior to the formal opening of the meeting, a Bishops' Day of Prayer, Study and Reflection on the renewal of faith will be sponsored by the NCCB Committee on Pastoral Research and

Practices. The bishops will also spend a morning during their meeting discussing the renewal of faith in regional groupings.

Attention also is expected to be devoted to a report on the results of the Synod of Bishops which recently concluded at the Vatican.

The current president of the bishops' conference is John Cardinal Krol of Philadelphia, who will complete his term of office at the November meeting. The vice president of the conference, Archbishop Leo Byrne of St. Paul and Minneapolis, died Oct. 21.

Nominees for the office of president include Archbishop Joseph L. Bernardin of Cincinnati; Archbishop William D. Borders of Baltimore; Cardinal John Carberry of St. Louis; Cardinal Terence Cooke of New York; Archbishop Thomas A. Donnellan of Atlanta; Archbishop Peter L. Gerety of Newark; Bishop George H. Guilfoyle of Camden; Cardinal Timothy Manning of Los Angeles; Archbishop John R. Quinn of Oklahoma City; and Archbishop John F. Whealon of Hartford.

The candidates for the offices of president and vice president of the conferences are those prelates who received the highest number of votes in a recent mail ballot sent to the entire body of bishops.

The president will be elected during the meeting by a simple majority vote. If such a majority is not received on the first or second ballot, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes on the second ballot will be the sole candidates on the third and final ballot.

The vice president will be chosen in the same manner from the remaining nine nominees.

Last June the NCCB Administrative Committee mandated the Communication Committee of the U.S. Catholic Conference, chaired by Archbishop Bernardin of Cincinnati, to study the reports of the Spring regional meetings of the bishops on "The Use of Modern Means of Communication as Instruments for Evangelization" — in order to develop a communication plan for presentation

to the general meeting of the bishops in November.

A Communication Committee Task Force subsequently studied the various recommendations from the regional meetings and developed a detailed proposal dealing with increased collaboration and sharing of resources nationally among those involved in communication work. It is this plan which will be submitted to the body of bishops.

A draft of a proposed statement on capital punishment, which is the work of the USCC Committee on Social Development and World Peace, was recently sent to all the bishops for suggestions. A final draft will be distributed and voted on.
