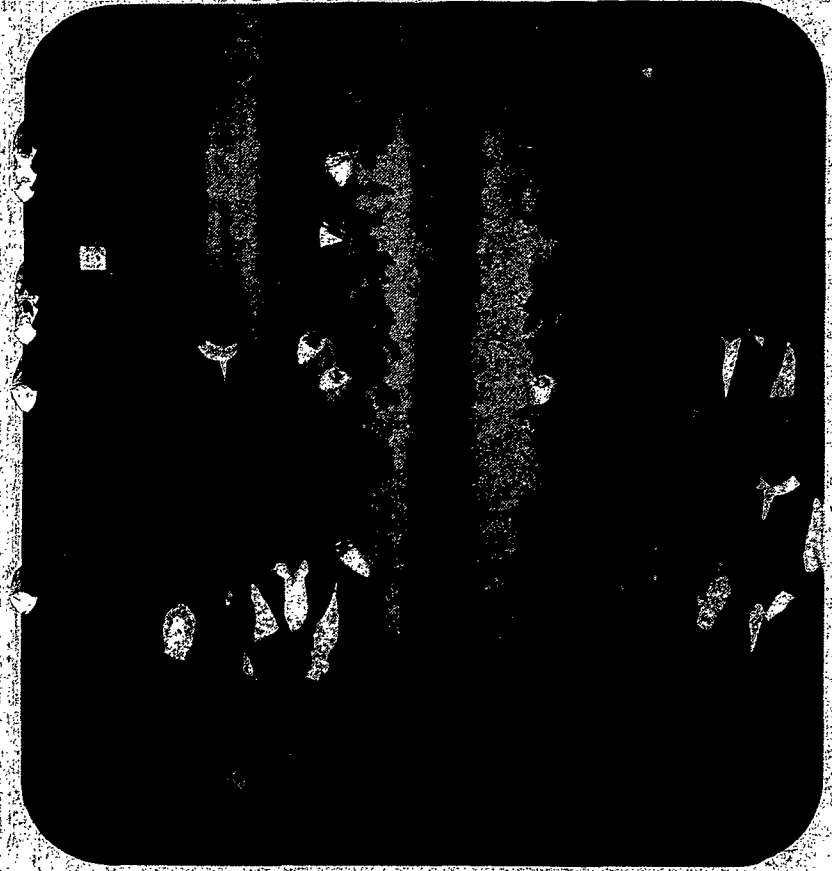
Those attending separated into small groups to discuss the four topics.

"We want the whole parish to be a part of this retreat," said Father Walter Wainwright, co-pastor.

The retreatants will hear talks on the Trinity, Christ in history, Christ in love, penance, mission and Christian Community. They will participate in dialogues, liturgies, penance and community building activities. Father Joseph McGoldrick, Sister Rosalinda Ramirez and Sister Gemma Fembert are the team conducting the retreat.

The retreat will cover three areas of spirituality: awareness — to become aware of God's call and to reflect on the life of the Trinity and community of mankind; conversion — as members of the Body of Christ to fashion one's self after the life of Christ; realization — to meditate on the dynamics of persons forming and developing a Christian community at all levels and to explore the practical ways of bringing the fruits of the retreat into the life of the whole parish.

Pope Paul said of the Better World Movement that, "It seems that the Movement interprets the genius of our times, i.e., to tend toward progress, to tend toward overcoming, to tend toward something more."
