Obviously I have been fortunate enough not to have experienced a natural disaster and the prospect of a hurricane or a tornado invokes the same negative feelings in me as anyone else:

But there was little to fear in the intensity of those frenzied rains. My grandparents lived in the country. The house and woodshed and springhouse along with the chicken coop and outhouse backed up against a mountain. The one-room school house, the general store and five or six houses stood on the other side of a stream and a wooden bridge. Our isolation was complete except for Cilbert, the Indian who lived in a shack high on the mountain behind us. And he visited infrequently.

Our front porch, only 10 yards from the stream, held a long bench and a high back swing which hung from the rafters.

When the rain began and we were called from the "crick" or its banks where we made lovely if

Cardinal Leger To Be Pastor In Montreal

Montreal Que. [RNS] — Cardinal Paul Emile Leger, who resigned as archbishop of Montreal eight years ago to serve at African leper colonies, is returning here as pastor of a Montreal church.

The surprising announcement, made by Archbishop Paul-Gregoire, said the Cardinal would take over Ste. Madeleine Sophie Church, a French-speaking parish, "in the very near future."

Cardinal Leger could not be reached for comment immediately.

Archbishop Gregoire, who succeeded Cardinal Leger, said in his statement. "After having lived for five years in Africa, where he created the re-education center of Yaounde (capital of Cameroon) and numerous leprosy clinics, the cardinal has organized his operations to be self-supporting:

"He has also traveled to several countries to make Christians aware of the needs of the people in underdeveloped countries."

At night my cowardly streak, would take over and I would quake in bed at the sound of the rushing creek and the mournful cry of the whippoorwill and remember all too vividly the story somebody, had told about spotting a bobcat in one of the nearby hollows.

But in a daylight storm with my intrepid barefoot aunt at my side and a patchwork quilt as our shield we were invincible.

"We do not have to be reminded of our own financial burdens," Father said. "We all feel the crunch of inflation, unemployment, and the rising cost of living. Perhaps our Christmas will be less extravagant this year, and maybe that's good, if it helps us to realize more the true meaning of the birth of Christ and the blessings of life that we have.

"But in these days of Advent preparation," Father emphasized, "may we not forget those who are really so much worse off then we can even imagine. In a true spirit of giving may each of us afford a real sacrifice of love for God's poor in the missions!"

Father Reinhart explained that the Society for the Propagation of the Faith is the Church's official organization responsible for the support of the local Churches in poor mission countries.
