Dear Sister Agnes Catherine, Faculty, and Students of DeSales High School:

Permit me this opportunity to express my sadness at the decision to close DeSales High School at the end of the present academic year. As you may know, I was the principal of DeSales for the school years of 1953 and 1954 and I, too, regret its closing.

However well-thought-out this decision has been, it is still a tragic event inasmuch as it means there will be a reassignment of faculty, a loss of opportunity for Catholic secondary education in Geneva, and a loss to the entire Geneva community of an educational institution of deep tradition and richness.

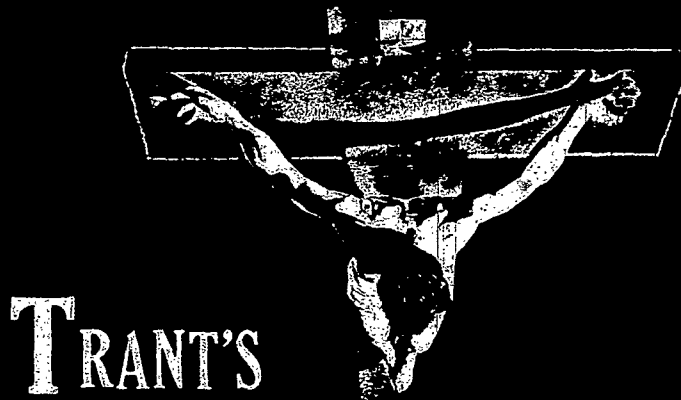
At this time when your Catholic High School is faced with terminating its educational services, I do not hesitate to challenge all the members of the DeSales family and the Catholic community of Geneva to assure the youth of Geneva that the Church is still much concerned about them and that youth ministry will not die with the closing of DeSales High School. I encourage all of you to begin to formulate new approaches to the Ministry of Youth which should take strength from the spirit and traditions of DeSales.
