Nazareth College has approved a proposal from three prominent business and civic leaders to build a "Casa Italiana" on campus which will serve as a Center for Italian Studies, according to Dr. Alice L. Foley, president.

Dr. Foley said that Joseph J. LoCurto, Joseph Mancini and Joseph P. Gagliano, will head a special committee which will arrange for funding the new building. The three community representatives will work closely with Dr. Virginia Otto, chairman of the Nazareth Foreign

The Interaction in Faith group also designed a special symbol to be used by the group. The symbol is three intertwining circles. Outside of each circle is a bright vellow background signifying people as individuals, while the inside color is gold signifying the aim to work together to enrich each other.
