# Fantastic Year for Roselli Wrestling Team

It's been a fantastic year for McQuaid wrestling, says Knights' head coach John Roselli.

"This is my best team ever," he explains, adding that while McQuaid shared the City-Catholic League championship with Bishop Kearney and Madison last year, this season the Knights won the title all by themselves.

"We won our first league title back in 1970-71 and we were co-champions last year. But this year is the best season yet with the best team ever," Roselli says.

McQuaid won the C-C crown with six wins in six starts and finished unbeaten in 15 dual meets overall — including victories over suburban powers Eastridge, Pittsford Mendon, Webster Schroeder, East Rochester and Attica, and C-C teams Bishop Kearney, Madison and East.

The season also marked another milestone for Roselli — the former McQuaid wrestler and St. John Fisher graduate gained his 100th victory as a wrestling coach at McQuaid. His teams at the Elmwood Avenue school have compiled a 112-28-2 record in 11 seasons.

Three surprises caught Roselli's troops and were the major factors why the Knights finished behind old nemesis Madison in the C-C tournament last weekend at East High according to Roselli.

Top-seeded Pete Springer, a McQuaid junior with an 8-1 league and 12-2 overall record, lost to Charlotte's Marvin Tillman at 129 pounds. Tillman, who only recently became eligible for the Lakesiders, caught Springer in a first round match.

Joe Nesser, a McQuaid senior, had a 5-0-1 league record (12-2-1 overall) and lost to Bishop Kearney's Joe Berardi in a semifinal match, after battling

Berardi to a draw in a previous league match.

George Todd, another McQuaid senior, owned a 6-0 league record and was 14-1 overall — but lost on a referee's decision to East High's Tony Pagan who went on to upset Madison's Walter Clyburn with a pin for the 158-pound title.

In other title matches the Knights' Rich Salamone lost to East's Mike Hendrix, 12-5, at 98 pounds, after defeating Hendrix during the season, 9-8.

McQuaid's Steve Miller (5-1 league, 14-1 overall), defending champion at 105, faced Charlotte's Dave Macrello who pinned Miller the previous week in a non-league match. Miller, who beat Macrello last year for the C-C championship, again decided Macrello, 9-2, for the 105-pound title.

Steve Wu, whom Roselli describes as the Knights' top sectional prospect, edged Cardinal Mooney's Pat Erb in the 119-

pound match, 3-2. Wu, a senior, won all six league matches and finished 15-0 overall (24-0 including tournament victories).

Tillman, who stopped Springer the first round, went on to win the 126-pound title with a 17-9 decision over Edison's Bob Moore.

Berardi, the semifinal winner over Nesser, decided Madison's Roy Hopkins, 6-3, for the 132-pound title, and Kearney's Bob Spinelli, 5-0-1 in C-C action, lost the title match at 138 to East's Al Barber.

The Knights' Jeff O'Hara, 6-0 in league and 13-2 overall, blanked East's Bill Luce, 8-0, at 145 pounds, and McQuaid teammate Ron Zeno, 4-2 league and 11-4 overall, pinned Kearney's Dave Hanlon at 3:34 to take the 167-pound crown.

Chris Polukis lost to two-time defending champion Mike DuPra of Jefferson, by a pin at 4:37, after beating DuPra last week in a non-league match. Ironically Polukis

led 3-1 in the third period before getting pinned.

Madison's Lamont Banks pinned Kearney's Mark Nicolini at 1:20. Nicolini and Banks fought to a draw earlier in the season and Nicolini pinned Banks in the Greece Athena holiday tournament.

Tournament champion Madison had five finalists and McQuaid had six, Roselli said, and the Wilson Parkers won only one championship while the Knights won four. "But they cleaned us up with third places, 4-0," Roselli explained, and that achievement plus those few surprises, helped put the Wilson Parkers on top.

Behind Madison (80 points) and McQuaid (74), were East (62), Kearney (58 1/2), Edison (45), Charlotte (35), Jefferson (33) and Cardinal Mooney (21).

McQuaid hopes to fare better than its City-Catholic rival this week in the Section 5 mat tournament which opens Thursday at Hilton and concludes Saturday at Rush-Henrietta.

Participants should bring a sleeping bag or bedding, towel, casual clothes as well as better dress for liturgy, gym wear, sneakers and swim trunks.

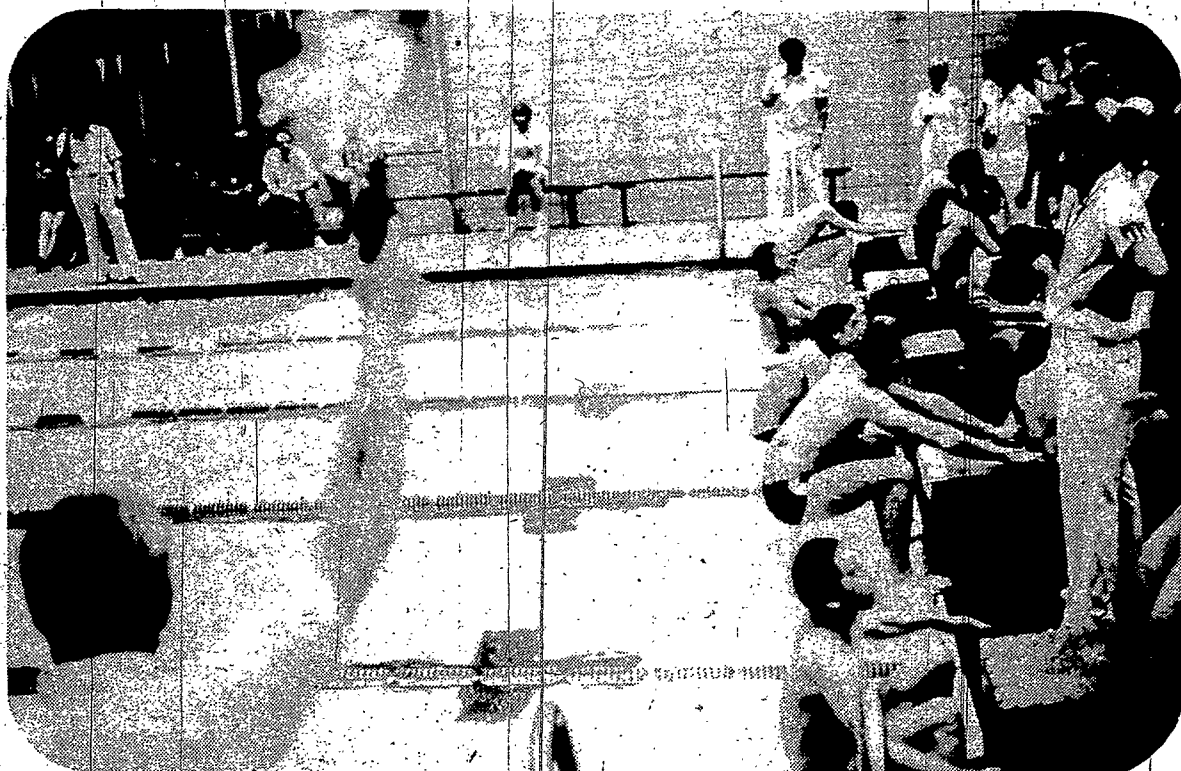
