Petrillo said, "that there are many issues which do not lend themselves to statistical or technical analysis. These are the issues that concern the citizens of this community and what factors they see as important in the delivery of hospital obstetrical service. To this end, the committee will be conducting a series

of public hearings to determine what factors are important to the community in the delivery of obstetrical care."

If the OB unit at St. Mary's is closed, it is estimated that the hospital will lose \$1,497,720, a year. Closing the unit would have a negative effect on the other hospital departments, particularly

the gynecology unit. Lewis mentioned that many of the doctors who staff the OB unit perform gynecological services as well. These doctors would rather perform their gynecological services at the same hospital where they perform obstetrics, Lewis said. And their patients most likely would be referred to a hospital which would offer both services.
