



Local Couple Given High French Award

Rochester professor and his wife, who is the language department chairman at The Allendale and The Columbia Schools, have been awarded the highest academic honor conferred by the French government for "outstanding contributions to the advancement of French language and culture."

Mr. and Mrs. Robert Menendes have been promoted from Knights to Officers in the Order of Academic Palms (/L'Ordre des Palmes Acad'emiques") conferred upon only five others in the United/States during the past year, according to French Embassy officials in New York. Appointment to the Order is the nighest academic/honor granted by the French government and is awarded to a select group of scholars and scientists. The order was created by Napoleon in 1808. The title "Officer" is the second highest rank in the order, surpassed only by "Commander," an honor which is rarely conferred.

Menendes, an associate professor of French, has been on the Nazareth faculty since 1965.

Mrs. Adeline Menendes joined the Taoulty of The Columbia School hine years ago and language department in 1966. Three years ago, she was named chairman of the language department of Columbia-Allendale. She has taught, exclusively in the French language, on every level of the school from on every level of the school from kindergarten to 12th grade.


