Communal Anointing Set For Ithaca Area People

Ithaca — More than 150 people from all over Tompkins County will gather at Immaculate Conception Church for a Mass of Communal Anointing on Sunday, May 4. Principal concelebrant for the rites will be Bishop Joseph L. Hogan, who also will preach the homily.

Father Thomas K. Cleary, pastor of Holy Cross in Freeville, and a member of the County Nursing Home Committee, which has been organizing the event since last October, noted that the rites will be celebrated for all the aged and infirm in the county.

The celebration is the first of its kind in the area, Father Cleary said.

Another unusual feature of the rites will be the commission of 30 Service Families as extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist These families will bring Holy Communion to those, who because of illness or age cannot attend Mass.

Their commission will become effective on May 11.

Lay participants in the rites will come from 'the Catholic Communities of Cornell University and Ithaca College, St. Catherine and Immaculate Conception parishes in Ithaca, Holy Cross, and St. James in Trumansburg.
