Directory Printed For Senior Citizens

People and agencies prepared to help the elderly are listed in a new directory circulating in Blessed Sacrament parish. An additional printing will serve the larger area of the Southeast Ecumenical Ministry.

Six pages, of clear, large type give simple explanations of services available in all the problem areas the directory committee could think of. There is a list also of social groups in the neighborhood, plus a list of the specific spiritual aids that a call to Blessed Sacrament rectory will elicit.

William Wegner, a member of the Human Development Committee group that made up the directory, recommends the project to other parishes.

About 10 HD committee members worked on the book. "We had a real good time," Wegner said, "because we learned a lot; we talked with a lot of people." He and Mrs. David Jensen were co-chairmen. "We didn't do so much — we are just proud of the people who saw it through," Wegner said.
