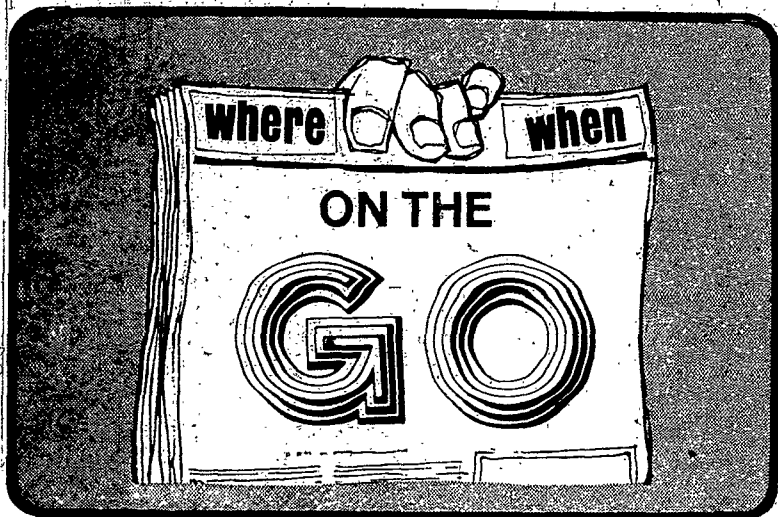

CYO Offers New Program

The CYO Youth Development staff has a new program, Awakening, that it is offering youth groups across the diocese this Spring.

Designed for groups preparing for Confirmation, Awakening is a one-day program, conducted by members of the CYO staff, and consists of various, structured experiences, discussions and liturgy.

Awakening begins with warm-up activities to get participants interacting with each other. The group is then divided into smaller groups in which youths work together on several tasks. The tasks are both fun to do and are designed to reinforce basic principles of Christian living: commitment to others, fulfillment of responsibilities; working together and sharing one-self with others. The day ends with a liturgy or period of reflection.

The youth development staff provides the materials necessary; the participating group is responsible for providing the place, making lunch arrangements, and requesting a priest when Mass is desired.

Awakenings already have been staged for more than 250 youths from Our Lady of Lourdes, Our Lady of Perpetual Help, St. Paul in Webster, Nazareth Hall and St. Christopher. In addition to groups preparing for Confirmation, the program is open to any interested group.

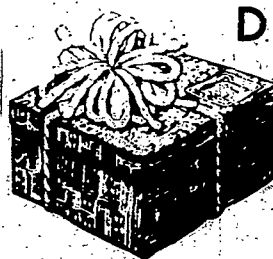
