More Rights Urged For Farm Workers

Albany — The farm worker is entitled to "the simple rights nearly every other worker in the state enjoys," said the New York State Catholic Conference in urging passage of farm labor legislation.

"At present the farm worker is in the third most dangerous occupation; has no unemployment insurance; works in an industry with over 800 deaths and 80,000 injuries each year from pesticides . . . and still has no coverage under the State Labor Relations Act," said Charles J. Tobin, Jr., secretary of the conference.

Tobin explained "that we have written a special letter outlining our position to every member of both houses of the Legislature in New York State. That is extremely unusual for us to do," Tobin said, and only illustrated how important the conference considers this matter.

The State Catholic Conference speaks for the state's Catholic Bishops in the field of public affairs.

What the conference requests is strong support for Senate 4022 and Assembly 5336, the companion bills that will at long last include the farm laborer under the State Labor Relations Act and give him the same rights other workers in the state already have and have had for five years.
